PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Gina Morris inquired about the communication of a recent alleged bomb threat at the C.E. Budd Building. She expressed the need for parents to be informed right away, rather than days later as was done in this case. After much discussion, Mr. Miller said that the district would communicate as soon as possible.

Les Morris said he is fearful that the district might wait to report an incident until it's too late. Mr. Miller expressed that over-reaction can also occur, as well as copy-cat situations. Mr. Carroll emphasized that threatening incidents are considered carefully, and can be handled in different, suitable ways. Dr. Stinemetz inquired as to who determines the threat level. Mr. Miller responded that the principal and superintendent discuss each case, and do notify the police department. However, the police department only gets involved in substantiated threats.

Judy Ferguson asked why the police were not called right away. Mr. Miller said that the police department encourages the school district to handle the situation, including discipline, but they are informed of threatening situations.

Deb Cowen raised concern about the appearance of the high school restrooms in the LHS gym building. The Building & Grounds Committee will consider renovations.
