The Loudonville-Perrysville Exempted Village School District is located in southern Ashland County approximately 20 miles southeast of Mansfield, OH at the intersection of SR 60 and SR 39. The district covers 119 square miles and includes portions of Ashland, Holmes, Knox and Richland counties. District territory in Ashland County includes Green, Hanover & Lake Townships as well as the Villages of Loudonville and Perrysville. District residents are part of the 7th Federal Congressional District, 19th or 22nd Ohio Senate District, and 2nd, 68th, or 70th Ohio House Districts. The district population is 7,881. The Median Household Income is \$48,372. District operating expenditure per pupil in FY 2022 was \$13,619.
