## The Search

The Loudonville-Perrysville Exempted Village School District is seeking a highly qualified educational leader for the position of superintendent. The new superintendent will replace John E. Miller, who will retire this summer after 18 years of valued service to the district. The Ohio School Boards Association (OSBA) will facilitate the search process, with Teri Morgan assisting the board in this important work.

## About the Community

The Mohican area is located in Ashland County, Ohio, and flows through parts of Holmes and Knox Counties. It is centrally located between Cleveland and Columbus. Mohican is one of Ohio's largest outdoor recreational complexes and is the official Canoe Capital of Ohio. Whether spring, summer, fall or winter, Mohican is the destination that offers adventure, events, history and arts. The area provides a wonderful backdrop for year-round outdoor adventure, whether it is hiking, canoeing, camping, mountain biking, horseback riding, fishing or more.

Mohican encompasses the communities of Loudonville and Perrysville, which are conveniently located within minutes of Mohican State Park, Mohican-Memorial State Forest, Malabar Farm State Park and Pleasant Hill Lake Park. A local museum, historic theater and working grist mill provide a living history to the area. The Loudonville Public Library is located in the heart of the village and boasts many resources and materials. Recent national recognition as a "four-star library" and an active relationship with the Loudonville-Perrysville EV School District are listed as major accomplishments.

Many school alumni still live and work in the area. Local manufacturing industries including Mansfield Plumbing Products and Step2, and

the Loudonville-Perrysville EV School District are among the largest employers in the area. The area offers a low cost of living with a high quality of life and an unemployment rate below the state average.

Communication with the local community is encouraged and used by organizations and committees such as academic, athletic and music boosters, Budd School Partners in Education, McMullen Parents Association and various school alumni organizations. A group of school alumni have established a school district endowment fund and the Loudonville-Perrysville School Foundation.

## The Mission

The Loudonville-Perrysville Schools, in partnership with students, families and the community, will provide a safe and challenging educational environment where all students have the opportunity to reach their highest potential and become well-rounded citizens in a global society.

## About the District

*Providing Quality Education to Mohican Country's Children*

The district serves approximately 1,200 students in grades pre-K-12, and its enrollment area covers 119 square miles, including portions of Ashland, Holmes, Knox and Richland counties. The district strives to offer students an achievement-oriented, opportunity-rich educational program within a supportive atmosphere.

- Loudonville High School is fully accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.
- In addition to the core academic subjects taught by classroom teachers, elementary school students receive regularly scheduled instruction from specialists in music, art, physical education, library use and computer technology.
- Specialists in reading, school psychology, gifted education, instructional technology, guidance and counseling, and special education are available to support the work of the classroom teachers.
- School-community liaison services connect students and families to appropriate mental health and other social service providers and natural support systems, which strengthen and empower families to support students in becoming successful in school.

- The district maintains a fairly comprehensive program for special needs students, believing all students can learn.
- The district operates its own electronic learning program — Redbird A+ Learning On-line — for students in grades seven-12.
- All students in grades two-12 receive netbook computers at a one-to-one ratio.
- Components of the district's award-winning music program include choral groups and marching and concert bands.
- An outstanding cocurricular program features 10 boys and 10 girls interscholastic sports as well as a variety of clubs and organizations. These cocurricular programs are an integral part of school life and student development.
- A comprehensive library/media and technology program serves as an important part of the instructional process, teaching students library use and research skills, reinforcing the curriculum and preparing students for life and work in the information age.

In addition:

- R.F. McMullen School is a U.S. Department of Education National Blue Ribbon School and Ohio Association of Elementary School Administrators Hall of Fame School.
- Loudonville High School is recognized by U.S. News & World Report as a Best High School.
- Loudonville High School offers more than 30 semester hours of college classes on campus through the College Credit Plus program in addition to five nationally accredited STEM engineering courses and a competitive Vex Robotics Team currently ranked 18th in the world. Qualifying students have access to a regional International Baccalaureate program.

The board of education is working to select a superintendent candidate who will partner with the board, staff members throughout the district and the greater community to provide and maintain high quality programs in a safe and dynamic learning environment.

There are four buildings in the district:

- R.F. McMullen Elementary School (307 students in grades K-three)
- Budd Elementary School (285 students in grades four to six)
- Loudonville Junior High School (188 students in

grades seven-eight)

- Loudonville High School (400 students in grades nine-12)

Loudonville is within 50 miles of Ashland University, College of Wooster, Ohio State University-Mansfield Campus, Denison University, Kenyon College, Mt. Vernon Nazarene University and North Central State College.

## Leadership Criteria

The Loudonville-Perrysville Exempted Village School District Board of Education invites applicants who have a commitment to strong, positive board/superintendent relations. - Possesses excellent speaking and listening skills, and an openness to ideas expressed by the board, staff, parents, students and community.
- Holds high expectations for self and others, especially in accountability, honesty, integrity, accessibility, involvement and commitment to the school.
- Willing to become an active, contributing member of the school district and the community and be comfortable with high visibility and accessibility.
- Experience as a fiscal manager with an understanding of issues facing schools today and a proven track record of working closely with the school treasurer, administration and board of education.
- Displays a positive, team-building attitude and a collaborative and participatory management style.
