The Mohican area is located in Ashland County, Ohio, and flows through parts of Holmes and Knox counties. It is centrally located between Cleveland and Columbus. The Mohican area has one of Ohio's largest outdoor recreational complexes and is the official Canoe Capital of Ohio. The district serves approximately 1,100 students in grades pre-K-12, and its enrollment area covers 119 square miles, including portions of Ashland, Holmes, Knox and Richland counties.
